

How to Identify a Red Knot

Breeding Plumage (March-May):

Russet-colored breast and a pattern of golf, buff, rufous, and black above



Non-breeding Plumage (January-March):

Brownish gray on top and pale on breast



Size: 23-25 cm tall

BILL: Short, straight, and black

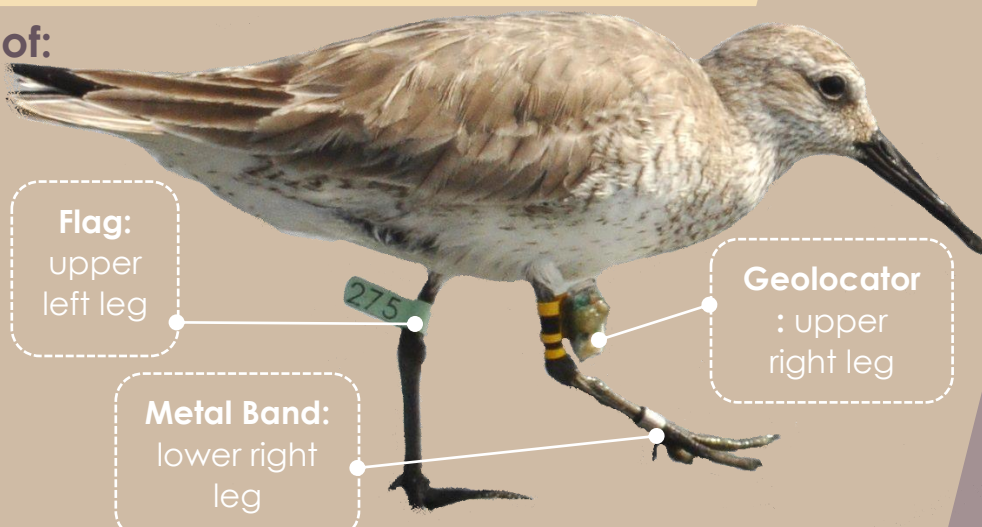
What You Should Look For

Found a Red Knot? Take note of:

- Date and Time of Sighting
- Exact Location

The Red Knot is flagged? Take note of:

- Take a picture if you can!
- Marker type (flag, metal band, geolocator)
- Color (green)
- Alpha-numeric code (275)
- Location on leg



Flag:
upper left leg

Metal Band:
lower right leg

Geolocator
: upper right leg
